RULES OF THE HORTICULTURAL SECTION

Any member intending to exhibit must give notice (on the Society's entry form) to the Horticultural Secretary on or before Tuesday 19th September 2017 and all fees must accompany entries. Late entries will only be accepted at the Horticultural Secretary's discretion, and in any case must be on an entry form.

All articles exhibited remain at the risk of the exhibitor. The Committee will use their best endeavours to preserve the exhibits, but must decline to be responsible for any damage or loss.

All exhibits to be staged in the tent (labels supplied) **BEFORE 9.15 am** on the morning of the Show.

THE TENT TO BE CLEARED AT 9.30 AM FOR JUDGING AT 9.45 AM.

Labels for Novice Art and Floral Art will be distinguished in red. Exhibitor's wishing to be classified as 'novice' in these classes (i.e. not a previous 1st prize winner at Flintham) should write 'novice' after their name on the entry form.

The tent will be closed at 4.30pm, when all exhibits may be removed. The tent will be cleared at 5.30pm. Please show your Exhibitors Ticket when collecting exhibits.

All exhibitors in the Flower Section must provide their own vases or bottles. Water is provided.

The entry-fee and prize money for each class is shown at the head of each class or section in the schedule, together with any special rules or guidance.

The Judges reserve the right to withhold any prize should there be insufficient entries in any class. In the event of a tie for most points for a special prize or trophy, the Judge will decide the winner on merit.

Prize money will be available for collection after 1.30pm. Prize money not collected on the day will be forfeited.

All exhibits must be the property of the Exhibitor and must have been in his or her possession for at least two months.

In order to ensure that the competitive conditions are fulfilled, the Committee reserves the right to visit, before or after the Show, gardens from which exhibits have been entered.

Any protest regarding exhibits must be made in writing and handed with £1.00 to the Secretary within one hour of the Show being open to the public. The deposit will be forfeited should the protest be considered by the Committee as being of a frivolous nature.

The Judges' decision shall be final in all cases.

NOTES CONCERNING HOME PRODUCE

Short crust pastry – use Plain flour only.

Savoury Flan to be made using a loose bottomed flan tin

All baked items other than bread, to be displayed on paper plates or appropriate doily.

Lemon Curd – MUST have cellophane and wax disc.

Jam – Preferable to have wax disc and cellophane. NEW screw top acceptable.

Chutney and Piccalilli – Screw metal lid with plastic coating (Lakeland Plastics) – NEW screw lids must be put on while preserve is HOT, though not boiling.

Chutney - MUST be over 2 months old

Jars in each case to be not less than 350gms (12oz) and completely filled.

APPLE CAKE

Ingredients: 8oz Cooking Apples, peeled, cored and chopped, 8oz Sultanas, 1/4pt Milk, 6oz Soft Brown Sugar, 12oz Self Raising Flour, 2 level tsp Mixed Spice, 6oz Butter - melted, 1 Egg – beaten, 1oz Demerara Sugar – for top.

Heat oven to 170°C, 325°, Gas Mark 4. Mix together the apples, sultanas, milk and sugar. Sieve together the flour and spice, then run in the butter. Add the fruit mixture and egg. Mix well.

Place in a buttered and lined 20cm (8”) round cake tin. Sprinkle with the demerara sugar and bake for 1¾ hours until risen and golden brown.

SHORTBREAD BISCUITS

Ingredients: 4oz Butter, 2oz Caster Sugar plus extra to finish, 6oz Plain Flour.

Heat oven to 190C/375F/Gas 5. Beat the butter and the sugar together until smooth. Stir in the flour to get a smooth paste. Turn onto a work surface and gently roll out until the past is 1/2in thick. Cut into rounds and place on to a baking tray and chill in the fridge for 20 minutes. Bake in the oven for 15-20 minutes, or until pale golden-brown. Sprinkle with caster sugar and set aside to cool on a wire rack.

PARSNIP AND ORANGE SPICE CAKE

Ingredients: 12oz Parsnips, peeled and coarsely grated, 8oz Self Raising Flour, 4 Eggs, 12oz Caster Sugar, 8floz Rapeseed Oil, 3oz Dessicated Coconut, 3oz Raisins, ½ teaspoon Salt, grated rind of 1 large Orange, 1 generous teaspoon Mixed Spice, ½ teaspoon Grated Nutmeg, 1 teaspoon Baking Powder

Heat oven to 180°C, 350°, Gas Mark 4. 2 x 1lb Loaf tins, lined.

In a large bowl mix parsnips, flour, coconut, spices and baking powder. Stir in sugar, orange rind and raisins. Beat eggs together, make well in centre of mixture, pour in oil, then eggs, stir until smooth.

Place in tins, level the surface and push any raisins below surface. Bake on centre shelf for 50-55 minutes. Show the best and eat the rest!
