Rules for Hedging

Entry - By invitation only

Note: COMPETITORS' ATTENTION IS DRAWN TO THE HEALTH & SAFETY EXECUTIVE REGULATIONS ON CHAINSAW SAFETY

The rules for the hedging competition are as follows:

- Competitors to cut and lay 11 yards (10.06 metres) of hedge making a start and a finish and sharpen their own stakes in the best manner.
- 22 Stakes for each competitor.
- The first two layers to be laid one on either side for the other competitor to finish.
- All the brush to be put away as per Steward's instructions.
- Competitors to be at field at 8.30 am and start plashing at 9.00 am
- Assistance only at the Steward's discretion.
- No dead wood to be left in the hedge.
- In accordance with the Health & Safety Executive regulations, Flintham & District Agricultural Society insist that competitors must use safety equipment when using chainsaws. Any competitor who fails to comply with this regulation will be immediately disqualified.

We reserve the right to amalgamate classes if less than 3 entries in class. Under current regulations, Flintham Show is exempt from requirements for pre-movement TB testing for all cattle.

Entries in classes 43-46 will be weighed at the Showground on arrival. Divisions will be made as equally as possible by the stewards. This will be dependent on the number forward and the weight on the day.

All exhibitors will receive £20 appearance money on completion of the Judging.
